Major habitats Vyftienmyl se Berge Succulent Shrubland

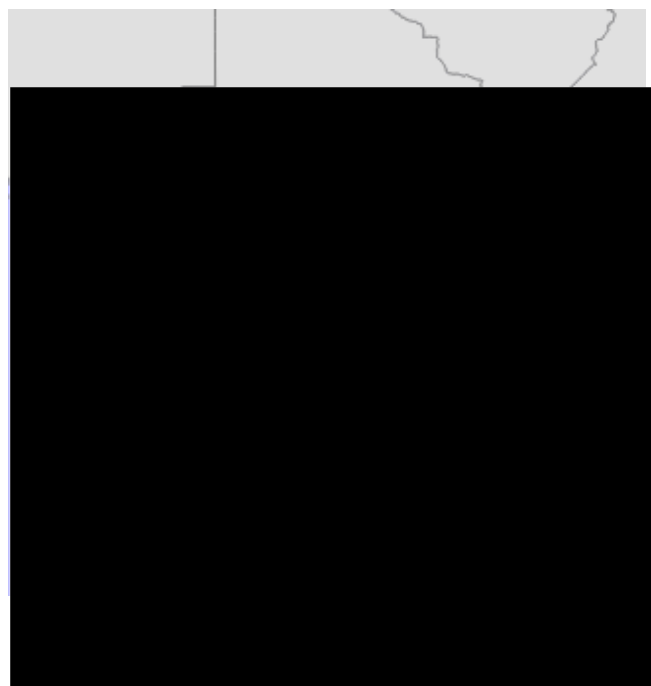
Description Quartz-rich sandstone crevices, upper south-facing slopes.

This species is declining due to over collecting of mature individuals from the wild for the succulent trade (P.C.V. van Wyk pers. obs.).
